Defining Your Count

 $\textbf{Stationary Count:} \ \ A \ count \ made \ from \ a \ single \ location. \ Examples \ are counting \ birds \ from \ an \ observation \ tower \ or \ in \ your \ backyard.$

Traveling Count: A count where you do not remain in the same location with an estimate of the distance traveled. If you walk 2 km. on a trail and return via the same route, record the distance as 2 km. Only record new birds that you are certain you did not previously detect on the return. Examples of traveling counts are birding on a trail, driving an auto loop, and birding on a boat trip. Counts are most helpful when they cover relatively short distances (preferably less than 5km.).
